The exhibition 'Blind Memory' is an innovative multimedia exhibition of images of Africa, Slavery and Resistance.

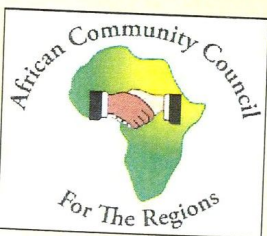
The exhibition attempts to answer the question 'What memories do we have of this great tragedy in humankind known as the trans-Atlantic Slave trade?
