


The Globe of Freedom




This resource is the culmination of a project to commemorate the bicentenary of the Abolition of the Slave Trade Act in 1807.

Gaining inspiration from Nottingham Castle Museum's Wedgwood collection, and in particular the famous Wedgwood medallion, young people from Nottingham's African Caribbean community designed a one off piece of ceramic artwork, which was produced at Wedgwood's Stoke workshop and is now on display in the Castle Museum.

The resource comprises a set of 6 A1 exhibition panels that illustrate the project, as well as a copy of the resultant artwork, the *Globe of Freedom*.









These information panels can help to meet the requirements of the national curriculum for **English**, **art and design**, **history**, **geography** and **drama** at **KS1** to **3**.
