This DVD provides a range of sources and information for secondary schools about the abolition of slavery, and Kent's connections with the Transatlantic Slave Trade.

The Ties and Lives project, funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund, examined the impact of slavery in Kent. The Project researcher Dan Easley's task was to foster an understanding of this subject, exploring the historic records of Kentish slave-owning families and abolitionists.

Evidence was investigated within three main archival collections: the Cobb Papers, the Romney Papers, the Inglis/Harrison Papers, as well as other sources held in Kent's archives centres and the printed collection of Canterbury Cathedral Library.
