Remembering Slavery



25 March 2007 marked the 200th anniversary of a British Act of Parliament which stopped ships carrying Africans slaves to British colonies in the Caribbean and the Americas. The people already enslaved across the British Empire were not given their freedom until 1838. It was another 50 years before slavery was abolished in the Americas.

Across the world today many forms of slavery still exist.
