





Stitch 'N' Time'

AWAC through workshops, will reproduce slave quilts as used the underground railroad to communicate routes of safe passage from the southern states to northern states of America, whilst doing so encourage participants to explore the historic context of African textiles and their use as storyboard.

'Ancestral Souls' African Women's Arts Collective (AWAC) will collaborate with African and African Diasporic women to produce 200 doll symbolic representation of African and African Diasporic peoples to commemorate the lives of millions of Africans forcibly transported to the Americas.

The completed dolls will form an exhibition along with other textile and art works throughout the bicentenary.
